Goodwood Revival

Motor racing with a vintage twist



There's so much to be enjoyed at Goodwood Revival

It's the only motoring event of its kind to be staged entirely in a period theme. Goodwood Revival, which runs from 6 to 8 September at the Goodwood Motor Circuit, celebrates the halcyon days of motor racing with the accompanying glamour of the 1940s, 50s and 60s.

Running on Friday evening for the first time in ten years, The Sussex trophy, which celebrates World Championship sportscars from 1955 to 1960, will be a thrilling 60-minute race of iconic motors like the Lotus 15, Lister-Jaguar Knobbly and Ferrari 246S Dino.

Revival racing highlights also include The Goodwood trophy, where Grand Prix and Voiturette cars from 1930 to 1951 with ERAs, Maseratis and Alfa Romeos take to the track. A firm favourite with the Revival crowds, the Earl of March Trophy will welcome 500cc Formula 3 cars, while pre-1955 Grand Prix motorcycles will compete for the Barry Sheene Memorial Trophy.

Away from the action, visitors can enjoy all things vintage – from fashion and motoring memorabilia to make-overs, antiques and collectables. Dine in style or take your pick of the eateries, with everything from top notch hospitality packages to grab and go options on offer.

Festival fella

Barry Ashworth from the Dub Pistols talks all things Mucky Weekender

"If you're doing something you love, you never work a day in your life." So says Barry Ashworth, front man of The Dub Pistols, the reggae-driven music festival stalwarts.

The Dub Pistols started out in the mid-90s with Barry on the decks while musicians jammed over the top. "I was a ducking, diving South London graduate of the Summer of Love generation who started a band because I loved Happy Mondays and never looked back," he says. "We've had ups and downs, but we've weathered the storms and come up smiling."

Hits have included Cyclone, Mucky Weekend and Running From The Thoughts. The 2023 album Frontline hit number three in the UK charts.

This year The Dub Pistols has been on a European tour. A new album 'Dub Pistols versus The Freestylers' will be released later this year, with collaborative artists including General Levy, MC Spider and Tippa Irie. UK summer festival gigs include Glastonbury, Bestival, Beat Herder and Mucky Weekender which comes to Winchester from 5 to 7 September. Four stages at Vicarage Farm will host the likes of The Dualers, Dreadzone and Marshall Jefferson – and of course The Dub Pistols themselves. Mucky Weekender was created by Barry in 2019.

"Mucky Weekender gives me the opportunity to curate unique experiences, showcase talented artists, and create unforgettable memories for music-lovers," he says. "Each year, we try to push boundaries, introduce new experiences, and welcome new artists from diverse genres. The thrill of seeing a crowd come together, dancing and celebrating in unison, is like nothing else.

"The festival started off in East Sussex but when we got the chance to move it to Vicarage Farm, I couldn't believe my luck. The site has everything we could ask for – sprawling meadows for camping and a stunning woodland backdrop for stages.

"Having the festival in Winchester is also significant for the band as The Railway Inn was one of the first venues The Dub Pistols sold out in the early part of our career. Johnny, our guitarist lives just five miles away."

Keeping the festival at low capacity is important to Barry – 4000 tickets are released for each day. "By limiting the number of attendees, the festival really encourages people to make connections and get together," says Barry. "It's a celebration of creativity, community, and the power of music which brings together people from all walks of life. Those who come to the festival on their own often leave with a tribe of new friends. That always blows me away."





Bringing the city streets to life

Hat Fair director Andrew Loretto celebrates 50 years of revelry

It's the UK's longest-running festival of outdoor arts, celebrating its 50th anniversary this year. Hat Fair, from Friday 5 to Sunday 7 July, offers street theatre, circus, music, dance and more.

Director, Andrew Loretto is at the helm. "Hat Fair was conceived as a busking festival in 1974 and is inspired now as it was then by the people, heritage and public spaces within the city," Andrew says.

"It's a bit like letting your cheeky cousin loose in Winchester: It's playful, it's fun and it's full of surprises, but most of all it entertains and encourages people to discover city spaces in an entirely new way."

International artists will join those from across the country and from Winchester, offering interactive experiences for all ages. Some of the performances are specially commissioned for Hat Fair, which is now highly regarded on a national scale.

This year's festival opens with a carnival which will see school children and community groups parading through the city centre in costumes inspired by the theme, 'Look Back, Look Forwards, Look Up', In the evening, community choirs and dancers will congregate outside Winchester Cathedral for a joyous opening ceremony. "Hat Fair is not only important to the city but is also an event which performers far and wide want to be part of," Andrew says. "Highlights this year include Cloudscapes, combining communal cloud gazing with storytelling, Autin Dance whose work includes a 13-foot puppet and The Giant Wheel, a performance



featuring a 12-foot wheel, inspired by the impact of people working together:

Ensuring that the festival remains free is at the heart of making Hat Fair accessible to all, with sponsors including The Arts Council and The National Lottery, Winchester City Council and Winchester BID.

"Free performances not only make Hat Fair inclusive but also ensure we can offer our audiences the chance to try something a bit different," says Andrew. Hat Fair is also about bringing people together – not only from outside the city, but within the city too. "Something very special happens when people enjoy a shared creative experience, especially when it's in the open air," he continues "Hat Fair is about making connections between people, the arts and our city at all levels, and along the way offering plenty of fun."

Legal rights for SEN children

Hannah Adams from Shentons reveals why getting specialist advice is so important

When solicitor Hannah Adams set up a specialist education team at Shentons in 2021 dedicated to helping families, she could never have imagined how much demand there would be.

"Anyone with a child with special educational needs knows how difficult it is to get support," says Hannah. "Lack of understanding, discrimination and unlawful exclusions are all too common."

As a parent with a SEN child herself, Hannah realised how little help there was available and wanted to help others. "The law is there to support children and the local educational authority has a duty to abide by it," she says.

That's one thing in theory, but quite another in practise. Lack of SEN funding makes LEAs more likely to challenge applications for extra provision in the classroom purely because they don't have enough resources.

"In a pre-school setting, children with additional needs are often supported in small groups, and inclusive play makes it easier for them to thrive. It's at primary school that things become more difficult," says Hannah.

Children with complex needs are required to have an Education and Health Care Plan (EHCP), which details the special educational provision the local authority should put in place. Parents have a legal right to request an EHCP but often have no idea how to go about doing that. Complex reports are needed

as evidence. NHS or local authority experts can refuse services because certain thresholds are not met, despite these thresholds holding no foundation in law.

"Parents have a right of appeal against the contents of the EHCP if they are unhappy with it," says Hannah. "They can also appeal against a refusal by the local authority to carry out a needs assessment or to issue a plan after they have done the assessment."

Setting out alone to fathom your way through SEN legal process is difficult. "Most people seek specialist legal advice when it comes to other things that affect their family like divorce, but don't consider the importance of doing that for a SEN child," Hannah adds.

"Knowing where you stand is essential. For some parents, I'll handle almost all the process; for others I might work in an advisory role. We have a package of support at a fixed fee to review a child's case and to suggest the best ways to fight it.

"Parents need to understand the law so they can advocate for their children. Every child deserves an education that meets their needs, and every child also has legal rights to get those needs met."

Past, present and future

Adam King, headmaster of Prince's Mead talks community and climbing mountains with Emma Caulton as the school celebrates its 75th anniversary

Its drive leads through field and copse to an elegant Georgian manor house that seems more like a grand home than a school. This is Prince's Mead, a coeducational school and nursery for 3 to 11-year-olds.

Adam King is headmaster and is overseeing Prince's Mead's 75th anniversary year. The school has changed a great deal since it was set up by Miss Crystal Holme as a school for the daughters of Winchester College's dons. Those changes include moving to the magnificent Worthy Park House.

"Crystal Holme didn't view education as purely academic," says Adam. "She had a holistic approach and we have taken that forward. We are all about educating the whole child."

Prince's Mead is a school where children embrace adventure. Year 5 climbed Snowdon and Year 6 went up Scafell Pike, England's highest peak. "I don't know any other Prep school that takes an entire year group up a mountain," Adam continues.

"We are also a school where you will find kindness in abundance. It is one of our five values. Parents often use the word 'nurturing' to describe Prince's Mead, along with 'friendly', 'caring' and 'supportive'," he says. Community is a big part of school life. "We have created an amphitheatre in the grounds and are building a canopy in the woods – places where people can gather," Adam continues. "We have introduced a family focus on Friday mornings when parents join us for a full English breakfast before assembly. It's about creating opportunities and moments to come together and feel part of something special."

Looking to the future is important at Prince's Mead. "Technology will be a big part of our children's lives in their future careers, and we ensure they use it sensibly and safely here" Adam says. "Every child from Year 3



to Year 6 has their own Chromebook which is used in every lesson. Pupils can chart their progress and connect within our community on a safe platform."

It's evident that Adam loves his job. "What I cherish about my role is that every day is different. Working with children is exciting. They do the most amazing things – like the quiet boy who sang solo in a musical. As a very involved headteacher, I teach and I coach rugby. We have mixed hockey, rugby and cricket teams, and I've watched the girls on our rugby team get stuck in and come up smiling.

"We have recently introduced a new alumni initiative. If you have any connection with Prince's Mead, whether as a pupil or working here, we are asking people to re-engage. There are alumni events this year and we'd love to welcome students and staff back again."



On the crest of a wave

One to one with Sophie Bubb, head of sailing at Embley

Sailing at Embley isn't merely about mastering knots and tacking.''It's about honing life skills, fostering resilience, and assuming leadership roles,'' says Sophie Bubb, head of sailing at the independent school just outside Romsey.''It's a great way to build resilience and gain a sense of adventure. As students learn to navigate the winds and waves, they also navigate challenges and build confidence on and off the water.''

If anyone was made for the post, it was Sophie, a lifelong sailor who came through the Royal Yachting Association's youth racing squads, before working with professional sailing teams across the world including the Volvo Ocean Race and Vestas SailRocket team. She is married to a multiple round-the-world former professional ocean racer and together with their two young boys, recently returned from an 18-month sailing trip from the UK to New Zealand. "My love for sailing started as a child," she says. "I was given my first boat at the age of five and have never looked back."

Children at Embley's prep school get an opportunity to gain RYA I dinghy sailing skills in Year 5 and 6. In the senior school, sailing is timetabled from Easter to October half term as one of the sports options. Over I20 children get out on the water every month on the school's fleet of keel boats, dinghies and its 37 foot yacht which is moored at Lymington Yacht Club.



"Hands-on experience fosters a spirit of perseverance and determination – qualities that are invaluable in all aspects of life," says Sophie. "Students are encouraged to take on leadership roles and collaborate with their peers. Whether it's working together to rig a boat or strategising during a race, teamwork is at the heart of sailing. Students develop essential communication and interpersonal skills, learning to trust and rely on one another."

Such is the skill of Embley's sailors that they compete at events across the country, including the Round the Island Race and the British Schools Dinghy Racing Championships. Some have gone on to represent Great Britain at the Youth World Championships.

Beyond the technical skills and teamwork, sailing at Embley nurtures a deep appreciation for the natural world. "It gives our students a sense of stewardship and responsibility towards the sea, laying the foundation for a lifelong commitment to environmental conservation," says Sophie. "We have a resident marine biologist in our science labs and our boats also serve as platforms for scientific enquiry, enriching students' learning experiences.

Remembering the fallen

100 Years of Winchester College's War Cloister

Walk around the stillness of Winchester College's War Cloister and you can't help but feel moved. 2024 marks the 100th anniversary of this tranquil space which is the largest private war memorial in Europe. Row upon row of names of fallen former students line the walls.

Pippa Pomeroy is a former servicewoman who has helped create War Cloister tours, in part, to honour the fallen, and is now one of a team of guides. "The War Cloister was commissioned in 1922 by the then headmaster Montague Rendall and designed by Sir Herbert Baker and opened in 1924," she says. "There has been extensive conservation work over the last year and the names of every Wykehamist lost in warfare are as crisp today as the day they were carved into the walls."

2,488 members of the Winchester College community served in the Armed Forces during World War I and 514 died, predominantly in the army. Among them is Raymond Asquith, the son of Prime Minister Herbert Asquith and Douglas Acworth, one of the first recipients of the Military Cross. Their names are grouped not by rank or social standing, but by the year they started at the college. Majors' names are next to those of Privates. Everyone is equal here.

"Each week during World War One, the headmaster would read out the names of those who had died at the Sunday service," says Pippa. "All but 13 had passed through his hands. Some men were from the same family – as was the case with Douglas and his brother Thomas Gillespie. One of Douglas' letters to the headmaster included a wish for a 'Via Sacra' along the Western Front to remember the fallen. The Western Front Way is now a reality, with the college also creating its own Via Sacra through its grounds this year."





The 285 former boys who fell in World War Two are listed on the inner columns

of the cloister. There is an additional memorial plaque to the former pupils from Winchester College who have died in service since 1945.

But this is no solemn, dusty space. "The cloister was designed to be walked through by college boys of all ages every day and continues to be a thoroughfare that boys – and now girls – clatter through on their way to lessons," says Pippa. "New life is breathed here every day."

Join a War Cloister Tour and you'll learn about the symbolism of the stones that are laid into the ground, the regimental crests on the walls and the detail that was applied to every element of their design. You'll also hear stories of lives cut short, but lives lived well. You'll become part of the ongoing remembrance of young men lost but never forgotten; young men who walked the same college cobbles that you'll walk on the way out.



Pillow talk

Part and parcel of any prostate cancer diagnosis should be a discussion about sex, says consultant urologist Tim Dudderidge

It's the most common cancer in men, with one in eight diagnosed with prostate cancer. But the side effects of treatment can lead to erectile dysfunction and loss of libido.

Consultant urologist Tim Dudderidge from TD Urology offers private treatment for prostate cancer at Spire Southampton Hospital, with diagnostics also available at Sarum Road Hospital in Winchester: "Technological advances mean that we now have very targeted and minimally invasive surgical procedures for destroying cancerous prostate cells which cause low risks of nerve damage," he says. "However, if cancer has spread into the nerves or the prostate needs to be removed entirely, there can be changes in men's sexual function."

Self-referral for a private appointment offers you wait-free access to the latest advancements in cancer treatment. NanoKnife, which is not yet available on the NHS locally, but is available in Tim's private practice, uses electrical pulses and electrodes to puncture cancer cells' membranes to destroy them with precision. Patients are generally treated as day cases with minimal discomfort. Most can complete their recovery in five days.

Book direct with Tim and you'll see an internationally respected expert all the way through. Tim can also give you all the time you need to talk sex man-to-man. Tests, scans and diagnostic procedures can be completed



within a matter of weeks, with surgical interventions usually booked within a fortnight.

Under the NHS, a typical fast-track cancer pathway allows patients to meet with a cancer nurse within two weeks. Scans and biopsies are scheduled and can take several weeks before you see the nurse for results and later a consultant.

"After erectile dysfunction, one of the most common discussions we have around sex following prostate treatment is around losing visible ejaculation, which occurs when the prostate gland and two seminal vesicles need to be removed," says Tim.

"Men's orgasms feel different after this. as the rush of semen flow no longer takes place. When nerves are affected by surgery, getting an erection becomes more difficult. Post operative support can include medication, vacuum pumps and injection therapy to help."

Going private doesn't mean necessarily staying private. "Sometimes men book privately to get a second opinion," says Tim. "We can also refer back to the NHS. It's the time that we can offer in the private clinic that makes a huge difference to the patients we see."


