



Join the parade

Five ways to reduce your CGT liability

Cuts to the capital gains tax (CGT) exemption mean that arranging your investments as tax efficiently as possible is more important than ever. However, CGT can be highly complex, so it's important to seek expert advice to avoid paying it unnecessarily. Here are some ways to reduce CGT:

1. Use your CGT exemption

Your annual CGT exemption enables you to make tax-free gains of up to £6,000 in the 2023/24 tax year; this is due to be cut to £3,000 in 2024/25. This can't be carried forward into the next tax year, so making full use of it each year could reduce the risk of incurring a significant CGT liability in the future.

2. Transfer assets to your spouse or civil partner

Transfers between spouses and civil partners are exempt from CGT, so assets can be transferred from one partner to the other to use each person's annual CGT exemption. The transfer must be a genuine, outright gift.

3. Invest in an ISA / bed and ISA

Gains (and losses) made on investments held in an ISA are exempt from CGT. In the 2023/24 tax year, you can invest up to £20,000 in an ISA.

The tactic 'bed and ISA' involves selling investments to realise a capital gain and then immediately buying back the same investments inside an ISA. This enables all future gains on the investment to be CGT free. There are risks involved, so if you're unsure, speak to a financial adviser.

4. Invest in an Enterprise Investment Scheme

Any gains made on investments in an EIS (Enterprise Investment Scheme) are free from CGT if held for three or more years. In certain circumstances, you may be able to defer a capital gain by investing that gain in an EIS qualifying company.

The downside of EIS is that these schemes are higher risk than traditional investments.

5. Contribute to a pension

Making a pension contribution from relevant earnings could help you save on CGT because it effectively increases the upper limit of your income tax band. If, for example, you made a gross pension contribution of £10,000, the point at which higher-rate tax becomes payable would rise from £50,270 to £60,270 (2023/24 tax year). If your capital gain plus other taxable income fell within this extended basic-rate income tax band, CGT would be payable at 10% instead of 20%.

A Tim Tam with Elizabeth Stone

Liz Kavanagh meets the dynamic headmaster of Winchester College

I meet Elizabeth Stone, the headmaster of Winchester College in an office that is so grand that it wouldn't look out of place in a royal palace. The first thing she does is offer me a Tim Tam – the Australian version of a Penguin bar, gifted by a student to remind her of home. It's proffered straight from the packet, with a welcoming smile.

Elizabeth has crossed the world from her native Australia twice to work at Winchester College; firstly as a maths teacher and undermaster and again to be headmaster. "When I had a call inviting me to apply, I got a very definite tingle," she says. "The intellectual ambition, the richness of the co-curricular offering and our students' sense of purpose makes for a very special school. And that's even before you consider our history."

Founded in 1382 as a boys' boarding school, Winchester College has the longest continuous history of any English school. Elizabeth is its first female headmaster. "That doesn't weigh much on my mind," she says. "My role is to get the job done well."

The doorplate on her office remains 'Headmaster', inherited from her predecessors. "I'm big on recycling,' she says with a smile. "It's saved on stationery too."

Elizabeth joins the school as the second cohort of girls goes through its Sixth Form. "Working alongside the opposite sex gives our boys a run for their money and an appreciation of a different outlook," she says. "Everyone benefits."

Some of these girls have won bursaries. "I was a Rhodes Scholar for my Oxford Masters," she says. "Having to fund that would have made it untenable. Giving exceptional local students the opportunity to join us is important. We run hundreds of free talks and learning sessions for state schools every year."

'Manners Makyth Man' is the school motto. 'It's a liberating message,' says Elizabeth, 'and one that was incredibly forward-thinking in the 1300s when status was everything. Titles don't interest us here. We place value on our students' sense of purpose, encourage them to make a positive impact on the wider world and be true to themselves. If you can achieve those things in life, then all else will follow.'

Winchester children's clinical psychologist and author Dr Angharad Rudkin shares her tips:

- Make your teen feel more in control of their exams with a revision timetable and colour coding notes.
- Help them set realistic targets, using motivational reminders of deadlines on their phones to keep them going.
- While teens are used to juggling multiple screens at once, remove all but the one screen they're revising from to help with periods of focused revision.
- Sharing with others helps embed new information. Ask your teen to talk about information that they're learning.
- Research has found that if students write down what they are feeling about an exam before they go into it, this can help unload anxiety and help them to perform better.
- Do remember that your teen is not you. They will have their own way of working and you need to help them discover that rather than assume they will work the way you did.

Fast-track your prostate care

Going private takes the uncertainty out of waiting for NHS treatment, says consultant urologist Werner Struss from Winchester Prostate Clinic

Anyone who has ever had to wait for treatment for cancer knows just how hard another day of uncertainty can be. The most urgent cases rightfully get NHS priority, but for many men with prostate cancer treatment can be drawn-out over months.

"Prostate cancer is the most common cancer in men. but it's often relatively slow growing," says consultant urologist Werner Struss of Winchester Prostate Clinic. "In the earliest stages, many men don't even know they have it and assume they simply have age-related urinary

"Some prostate cancers grow too slowly to cause any acute problems. But others grow quickly and are more likely to spread. Prostate cancer is not always life-threatening but, when it is, the earlier you catch it the more likely it is to be cured."

Some patients diagnosed with prostate cancer are advised to take an 'active surveillance' approach with regular monitoring. Often, the cancer has not spread outside the prostate gland which means it can be treated in isolation, while still preserving the rest of the prostate.

Surgery may be needed for more aggressive cases as well as radiotherapy and/or hormone therapy depending on the severity of the growth/lesion. So why go private? "Waiting for treatment for cancer is really difficult for anyone to deal with," says Werner. "Some patients come to me because they want treatment sooner than they might get offered it on the NHS and don't want to put their lives on hold. Sometimes we can offer tests and diagnostics on the same day.

"Going private also means longer consultations and allows our patients more time to ask questions."

There are other benefits. "Within the NHS, patients can be transferred from one hospital to another and swap from one team to another, depending on the treatment they need," he continues.

"At both Circle Health in Winchester and Spire Southampton, I have the latest technology under one roof and patients stay with me all the way along. "That gives me access to precision diagnostics with MRI-guided biopsy, non-invasive high-intensity focused ultrasound and brachytherapy – a form of radiotherapy which can treat an isolated area without damaging structures around it. Reducing the side-effects of treatment means less time is needed for patients to recover."

Going private doesn't mean necessarily staying private. "NHS patients can choose to go private at any stage of their diagnosis or treatment," says Werner: "Sometimes men book consultations to talk things through or to get a second opinion. We can also do referrals back to the NHS for treatment or after-care. What going private

> does do, however, is put our patients in the driving seat of their cancer care. That can make a huge difference to the way that they feel about having prostate cancer in the first place."



Fencing lessons

Maxine Read from Trethowans reveals how legal support can help when it comes to boundaries

Pat and Dave are just the sort of neighbours that everyone wants. However, the fence that separates their garden from yours is in a poor state and leaning over your prize begonias, threatening to crush them entirely. Whose responsibility is it to fix the fence?

Maxine Read, an associate at Trethowans who specialises in dispute resolution says that the best way to sort out boundary issues is to first do your homework.

"Generally, you should start by looking at the deeds of a property," she advises. "Sometimes the deeds will say the boundaries are shared which means that both parties could be responsible for the upkeep of any dividing wall, hedge, fence or other physical structure."

A summary of the deeds is usually available for a small fee via the Land Registry and can be accessed online. Newer builds' deeds are more likely to come with covenants which define a buyer's maintenance obligations for their boundary.

"If your deeds don't have the answer you're looking for, it is worth doing some digging to see if there has ever been an agreement about the boundary," says Maxine. "Find out who planted dividing hedges, for example, and who has previously taken responsibility for maintaining them. It's also worth checking historic photographs or Google Earth images. Doing some detective work can really help.

"Having a friendly chat with your neighbour is always the first port of call," she adds. "If a rotting fence is causing both of your gardens to look neglected, sharing costs for a new one is a reasonable option.

"It's only when conversations about repairs haven't got anywhere that we tend to get involved. Then we will review deeds and can write a letter demonstrating that a falling fence, for example, is crossing a physical boundary or causing damage and needs to be rectified. Very often, that will be enough to spur a neighbour into action

"As with all legal matters, if you can sort out an issue amicably that's always the best way," she continues. "Good sense usually prevails in cases like these in the end, with very few boundary cases escalating into full legal action."


