Commemorating courage

A new exhibition marks the contributions of Gurkha units and individual soldiers in 1945, which played a crucial role in bringing an end to the Second World War. Victory in 1945 at The Gurkha Museum in Peninsula Barracks runs from 1 to 30 August, and showcases original documents, rare artefacts, inspiring narratives, and interactive activities – enhanced by expert insights.

Celebrate the bravery of the Gurkhas in Burma, (now Myanmar), listen to family members share their relatives' experiences as prisoners of war in the Far East and find out more about the events that unfolded in the region following the declarations of Victory in Europe and Victory in Japan, 80 years ago.

My Winchester Summer

The Mayor of Winchester, Councillor Sudhakar Achwal, shares his Summer must-dos

What's your favourite city Summer event?

Hat Fair: It fills Winchester with outdoor entertainment you won't see anywhere else and brings people of all ages together.

What do you enjoy doing most in Winchester during the Summer?

I'm a keen walker and Keats' Walk – from the city to St Cross through the Water Meadows – is one of my favourites. It inspired his poem 'To Autumn'. The views from St Catherine's Hill across Winchester are spectacular when the countryside around it is so lush and green.

What's your favourite pub for outdoor eating?

The Bishop On The Bridge at the bottom of High Street, where the garden looks over the River Itchen. I'm a real ale man and also like going to The Flower Pots Inn in Cheriton, which brews its own beer. It's been making award-winning cask ales and beers for over 30 years.



Where would you go for an ice-cream?

To Abbey Gardens, where the same lady has been selling ice-cream from her bicycle for years. Honeycomb is my favourite flavour, and the park, when it's full of flowers, is at its best in the Summer.

Where would you take your grandson for a day out?

He's very little now, but when he's older to The Watercress Line. I grew up in India when steam trains were still running, so the sight of the huge engines brings back lots of memories.

What book are you most likely to take on holiday?

A history book. When I go to The Arc, I head straight to the history section. I'm currently reading The Golden Road by William Dalrymple which is about how ancient India transformed the world. We have a good selection of bookshops



in the city, with P&G Wells and Waterstones great places for finding something new.

What's the best thing about being Mayor of Winchester? It's a great honour to serve the community and meet people who make a huge difference through volunteering. There's a Sanskrit saying about doing your duty to others without expecting applause. I wear my chain with pride, but also very much as a symbol of duty.

Feast on Summer food with sizzle

Tandoor grills at Gurkha's Inn

Gurkha's Inn on City Road cooks many of its authentic Nepalese dishes in its tandoor oven, giving them extra flavour in the cooking process. Tuck into barbecued spiced Chicken Tikka Shashlik and Tandoori dishes from its Grill Menu which include roasted lamb, chicken and king prawns cooked in this traditional way. Like it hot? Then order Gurkha's Revenge – grilled lamb or chicken in garlic and chilli sauce. There are plenty of vegetarian options here too.

At the steakhouse

Porterhouse on Jewry Street specialises in steak which comes sizzling from the grill from its open kitchen. Its two-course fixed menu is just \pounds 22.95 a head from Sunday to Thursday and includes an 8oz rump steak. If you're pushing the boat out, order the 32oz porterhouse steak for two on the à la carte dinner menu. All steaks are matured for 35 days before being cooked to perfection. Veggie? You'll find lots of non-meat options on the menu.

The sun's out and the weekend stretches ahead – time to invite friends and family round for some al fresco dining. Get out the barbecue but don't forget to visit your local butcher first. Not only can you get locally sourced meats at their best, but usually there's a friendly butcher on hand for top tips. Here are some of our favourites...

Cobbs Farm Shop

Cobbs in Headbourne Worthy has a butcher's counter that sources its meat from local farms in Hampshire, Wiltshire, Berkshire and the South Downs. Beef is expertly aged to develop flavour and all its pork is free-range. If barbecued fish floats your boat, buy it from Johnstons of Portsmouth's fish stall which is on site every Wednesday from 11 am to 2pm.

It's open from Thursday to Sunday from 10am to 4pm.

Why forest school?

Sam Victoria, forest school expert and founder of My Little Explorers reveals the many benefits of outdoor learning

Sam Victoria has a lifelong passion for nature and outdoor learning. Inspired by her own childhood adventures in woodlands and visits to forest school settings around the world, she set up My Little Explorers forest school in 2013.

Where did forest schools begin?

Forest schools originated in Scandinavia in the 1950s, rooted in a philosophy that values child-led learning in natural environments. The approach was introduced to the UK in the 1990s and is underpinned by six key principles: regular sessions in a natural setting, holistic development, child-centred learning, managed risk-taking, qualified leadership, and long-term engagement. These principles ensure that forest schools offer more than just outdoor play – it's a structured, evidence-based approach to education that nurtures confidence, independence, and emotional well-being.

Who is forest school for?

Forest school is for everyone – including babies, toddlers, preschoolers, primary-aged children, and those with additional needs. The approach is highly inclusive, adapting activities to suit different ages and abilities. Forest school offers sensory-rich experiences, opportunities for social interaction, and a calm, supportive environment that can significantly benefit mental health.

Forest schools align with the Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) by supporting key learning outcomes. Children develop communication skills through storytelling and reflection time in nature. Physical development is fostered with activities like climbing, digging and tool use, which promote coordination and strength. Just as important, personal, social and emotional skills are developed through teamwork, turn-taking, and collaborative outdoor play and problem-solving.

What are forest school activities?

Activities range from den building, bug hunting, and mud play to fire lighting and nature crafts. Safety is paramount: leaders carry out thorough risk assessments, maintain close supervision (especially during higher-risk activities like tool use or fire lighting), and ensure children are dressed appropriately for all weather – waterproofs and wellies are essentials. On rainy days, children can build shelters, explore puddles, or engage in storytelling undercover, turning all weathers into a learning opportunity and contributing to a deep connection to the natural world.

Where can I find forest school provision in the Winchester area?

Winchester and the surrounding countryside offer a great variety of forest school opportunities. At our My Little Explorers setting at Farley Mount we offer a nature kindergarten, stay and play sessions and holiday camps. And it's great to see schools such as Pilgrims', Prince's Mead and St Swithun's include forest school and outdoor learning sessions as part of their curriculum. Whether you're looking for regular sessions or one-off adventures, Winchester's forest schools offer a natural classroom where every child can flourish.
